To: All P&C Insurers, Including Surplus Lines Companies

The Missouri Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions & Professional Registration (DIFP) is initiating a data call to collect claims information related to losses incurred in Missouri due to the severe weather of May 22 of this year. The scope of the data call is as follows:

All P&C insurers, <u>including surplus lines insurers</u>, with business in force for the following lines of business should report:

Residential Property
Commercial Property
Private Passenger Automobile
Commercial Automobile
Business Interruption
Workers Compensation
All other lines that incurred losses due to the severe weather detailed below.

The information to be reported consists of costs arising from claims incurred due to the tornadoes and associated severe weather of May 22. There claims should be associated with two primary events:

- The 5/22 tornado that originated near Eldon, Missouri and terminated in Jefferson City Missouri.
- 2. The 5/22 tornado activity that impacted Barton and Jasper counties, including Carl Junction and Golden City.

Data should be updated monthly and then quarterly according to the following due dates:

First Filing: June 30, 2019 Second Filing: July 31, 2019 Third Filing: August, 31, 2019 Fourth Filing: September 30, 2019 Fifth Filing: December 31, 2019 Sixth Filing: March 31, 2020 Seventh Filing: June 30, 2020

Data should be filed on the standardized disaster reporting template developed by the NAIC. The Excel-based template is available at https://insurance.mo.gov/industry/filings/stats/index.php. Each updated filing should reflect

cumulative claims experience consisting of

Each updated filing should reflect all losses since date of occurrence,



including those reported on previous filings. Each filing should include experience through the 25th of the month in which the filing is due. One filing should be submitted for each insurer group. It is not necessary to file for each individual company.

These data are collected pursuant to 374.190 RSMo, and will be maintained as confidential to the extent permitted by law. However, aggregate data across all insurers will be released to the public.
