

MOVING TO/FROM MISSOURI

Moving from another state TO Missouri	
If:	Then:
You have moved to Missouri already AND hold an active non-resident license here (375.017.3 RSMo)	Complete the Change of Producer Status Form within 30 days of moving to Missouri
You have moved to Missouri within the last 90 days and do NOT hold an active non-resident license here (375.016.6 RSMo)	Complete a paper application and provide a statement indicating the date you moved to Missouri and the state you moved from.
You have moved to Missouri more than 90 days ago and do NOT hold an active non-resident license here (375.016.5 RSMo)	You must take the applicable exam and apply for a resident Missouri license online in Missouri.
You have moved to Missouri more than 90 days ago and hold an active/expired non-resident license here (375.016.5 RSMo)	You must take 16 hours of Missouri CE, 3 of which must be in ethics. You may then renew your resident Missouri license online .
If you have NOT yet moved to Missouri and do hold an active non-resident license here (375.017.3 RSMo)	Complete the Change of Producer Status Form within 30 days of moving to Missouri
If you have NOT yet moved to Missouri and do NOT hold an active non-resident license here (375.017.3 RSMo)	You may Apply for a non-resident license . You must complete the Change of Producer Status Form within 30 days of moving to Missouri.
NOTE: Contact the state from which you are moving to determine the requirements of that state for transfer of residency.	
Moving FROM Missouri to another state	
If:	Then:
You have moved from Missouri to another state already (375.017.3 RSMo)	Missouri only requires a Change of Producer Status Form to change your address within 30 days of moving. You should contact the state to which you are moving to find out what their requirements are.
You have NOT yet moved to another state (375.017.3 RSMo)	Missouri only requires a Change of Producer Status Form to change your address within 30 days of moving. You should contact the state to which you are moving to find out what their requirements are.
Note: The Missouri Department of Commerce and Insurance does not issue Letters of Clearance. If your new resident state requires a Letter of Clearance, Missouri may cancel your license upon request and/or update your license to non-resident status. Once the cancellation and/or changes are complete, the status of your license may be verified by all states through the National Producer Database (PDB) or through SBS. You may submit the Change of Producer Status form to cancel your license. That form may be found at https://insurance.mo.gov/industry/forms/index.php
