ORDER REFUSING TO ISSUE MOTOR VEHICLE EXTENDED SERVICE
CONTRACT PRODUCER LICENSE

On October 10, 2017, the Consumer Affairs Division submitted a Petition to the Director alleging cause to refuse to issue a motor vehicle extended service contract producer license to Gregory Alan Yancy. After reviewing the Petition, and the Investigative Report and additional records, the Director issues the following findings of fact, conclusions of law, and order:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Gregory Alan Yancy ("Yancy") is a Missouri resident with a residential mailing address of 1560 Estrada Drive #7, Saint Louis, Missouri 63138.
2. On November 1, 2016, the Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions and Professional Registration ("Department") received Yancy's Application for Motor Vehicle Extended Service Contract Producer License ("Application").
3. Background Question No. 7 of the Application asked Yancy the following:

Do you currently have or have you had a child support obligation?

If you answer yes:

- a) Are you in arrearage?
- b) By how many months are you in arrearage? _____ months
- c) What is the total amount of your arrearage? _____
- d) Are you currently subject to a repayment agreement to cure the arrearage?
(If you answer yes, provide documentation showing an approved repayment plan from the appropriate state child support agency.)
- e) Are you in compliance with said repayment agreement? (If you answer yes, provide documentation showing proof of current payments from the appropriate state child support agency.)

- f) Are you the subject of a child support related subpoena/warrant? (If you answer yes, provide documentation showing proof of current payments or an approved repayment plan from the appropriate state child support agency.)
 - g) Have you ever been convicted of a misdemeanor or felony for failure to pay child support?
4. Yancy answered "Yes" in response to Background Question No. 7.
 5. Yancy answered "Yes" in response to Background Questions No. 7a, indicating that his child support obligation was in arrears.
 6. Yancy responded to Background Questions No. 7c through 7f by indicating that he owed \$20,000 in arrears and that his arrearage was not subject to a repayment agreement.
 7. An investigation by the Consumer Affairs Division ("Division") of the Department revealed the following court order imposing a child support obligation on Yancy:
 - a. On May 17, 2010, Judgment on Dissolution was entered by consent obligating Yancy to pay the petitioner the sum of \$776.00 per month in child support. *Valerie A. Yancy v. Gregory A Yancy*, St. Louis Co. Cir. Ct., IV-D Case No. 91368008, Order No. 10SL-DR01881.
 8. The Division's investigation further revealed records from the Family Support Division of the Missouri Department of Social Services showing Yancy's total child support arrears as of September 30, 2017, to be \$31,022.76. *Valerie A. Yancy v. Gregory A Yancy*, St. Louis Co. Cir. Ct., IV-D Case No. 91368008, Order No. 10SL-DR01881. Indeed, Family Support Division records show Yancy has made only five payments since March of 2014, only two of which were for the ordered monthly support amount. Yancy has not made any payments since in November of 2015.
 9. It is inferable from Yancy's admissions in response to Background Question No. 7 and Yancy's payment history as recorded by the Family Support Division of the Department of Social Services that he has failed to comply with an administrative or court order imposing a child support obligation.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

10. Section 385.209 states, in relevant part:
 1. The director may suspend, revoke, refuse to issue, or refuse to renew a registration or license under sections 385.200 to 385.220 for any of the following causes, if the applicant or licensee or the applicant's or licensee's subsidiaries or affiliated entities acting on behalf of the applicant or licensee in connection with the applicant's or licensee's motor vehicle extended service contract program has:

* * *

(12) Failed to comply with an administrative or court order imposing a child support obligation[.]


11. The Director may refuse to issue Yancy a Motor Vehicle Extended Service Contract ("MVESC") producer license pursuant to § 385.209.1(12) because Yancy has failed to comply with a court order imposing a child support obligation. *Valerie A. Yancy v. Gregory A Yancy*, St. Louis Co. Cir. Ct., IV-D Case No. 91368008, Order No. 10SL-DR01881.
12. The Director has should considered Yancy's history and all of the circumstances surrounding his Application and exercises her discretion to refuse to issue Yancy an MVESC producer license.
13. This Order is in the public interest.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that Gregory Alan Yancy's Motor Vehicle Extended Service Contract producer license application is hereby **REFUSED**.
