ORDER REFUSING TO ISSUE INSURANCE PRODUCER LICENSE

On December 16, 2013, Carolyn H. Kerr, Legal Counsel and Counsel to the Consumer Affairs Division, submitted a Petition to the Director alleging cause for refusing to issue the insurance producer license of James P. Hoyt. After reviewing the Petition, the Investigative Report, and the entirety of the file, the Director issues the following findings of fact, conclusions of law and order:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. James P. Hoyt ("Hoyt") is an individual residing in Missouri.
2. On or about August 2, 2013, the Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions and Professional Registration ("Department") received Hoyt's electronic Resident Individual Producer License Application ("Application").
3. In his Application, Hoyt listed his residential and mailing addresses as 1730 Renee Lane, Poplar Bluff, Missouri 63901 and his business address as 1359 N. Westwood Blvd., Poplar Bluff, Missouri 63901.
4. In the section of the Application headed "Background Questions," Background Question No. 1 asks, in relevant part: "Have you ever been convicted of a crime, had a judgment withheld or deferred, or are you currently charged with committing a crime?"
5. Hoyt answered "Yes" to Background Question No. 1.
6. Hoyt provided the circuit court docket sheet relating to the crime, an undated, handwritten letter explaining the facts and circumstances that led to his conviction and requested the approval of his license application, and two letters of recommendation.
7. In the letter Hoyt provided with his Application, he explained that, "On a couple of occasions I got intoxicated with a coworker. Being foolish and playful, I urinated in public and was seen by females."

8. An Affidavit or Complaint in Felony Case,¹ filed on May 10, 2013, with the Dunklin County, Missouri Circuit Court, charged Hoyt with two counts of the Class B Misdemeanor of Sexual Misconduct in the Second Degree, in violation of § 566.093, RSMo, in that on two separate occasions, Hoyt “exposed his genitals ... under circumstances in which he knew that such conduct was likely to cause affront or alarm.” *State of Missouri v. James Hoyt*, Dunklin Co. Cir. Ct., Case No. 13DU-CR00579.

9. Hoyt pleaded guilty to and was convicted of one count of the Class B Misdemeanor of Sexual Misconduct in the Second Degree, in violation of § 566.093, RSMo, on June 17, 2013. The court dismissed the second count and sentenced Hoyt to six months in jail on the first count. It ordered Hoyt to serve seven days in the Dunklin County Jail on the first count, ordered him to serve two years of unsupervised probation, ending June 17, 2015, and required Hoyt to pay court costs of \$300.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

10. Section 375.141, RSMo (Supp. 2013)² provides, in part:

1. The director may suspend, revoke, refuse to issue or refuse to renew an insurance producer license for any one or more of the following causes:

* * *

(6) Having been convicted of a felony or crime involving moral turpitude[.]

11. Section 566.093 provides, in relevant part, as follows:

1. A person commits the crime of sexual misconduct in the second degree if such person:

(1) Exposes his or her genitals under circumstances in which he or she knows that his or her conduct is likely to cause affront or alarm;

* * *

2. Sexual misconduct in the second degree is a class B misdemeanor unless the actor has previously been convicted of an offense under this chapter, in which case it is a class A misdemeanor.

12. A crime involving “moral turpitude” is a crime involving “an act of baseness, vileness, or depravity in the private and social duties which a man owes to his fellowman or to society in general, contrary to the accepted and customary rule of right and duty between man

and man; everything 'done contrary to justice, honesty, modesty, and good morals'." *In re Frick*, 694 S.W.2d 473, 479 (Mo. banc 1985).

13. Category 1 crimes, since they necessarily involve moral turpitude, require no analysis beyond their elements to show moral turpitude. They require only a showing of a conviction or guilty plea. *Id.*

14. Sexual misconduct in the second degree, the crime for which Hoyt was convicted, is a crime of moral turpitude. *State Bd. of Nursing v. Sawyer*, Mo. Admin. Hrg. Comm'n, No. 00-2485 BN (April 3, 2001).

15. The principal purpose of § 375.141 is not to punish licensees or applicants, but to protect the public. *Ballew v. Ainsworth*, 670 S.W.2d 94, 100 (Mo. App. 1984).

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

16. The Director may refuse to issue an insurance producer license to Hoyt pursuant to § 375.141.1(6) because the crime of Sexual Misconduct in the Second Degree, in violation of § 566.093, is a crime of moral turpitude in that Hoyt's acts were "contrary to the accepted and customary rule of right" and to "modesty, and good morals." *In re Frick*, 694 S.W.2d 473, 479 (Mo. banc 1985).

17. Therefore, in applying his discretion, the Director has considered all of the facts and circumstances surrounding Hoyt's Application for licensure and, for all of the reasons given in this Order, exercises his discretion in refusing to grant Hoyt's insurance producer license.


18. This Order is in the public interest.

TO: Applicant and any unnamed persons aggrieved by this Order:


