**ORDER REFUSING TO ISSUE**  
**MOTOR VEHICLE EXTENDED SERVICE CONTRACT PRODUCER LICENSE**

On November 29, 2017, the Consumer Affairs Division submitted a Petition to the Director alleging cause to refuse the motor vehicle extended service contract producer license application of Tyler Gregory Vaughn. After reviewing the Petition, Investigative Report, and the entirety of the file, the Director issues the following findings of fact, conclusions of law, and order:

**FINDINGS OF FACT**

1. Tyler Gregory Vaughn ("Vaughn") is a Missouri resident with a residential address of 2801 Clearview Drive, Saint Louis, Missouri 63121-4555.
2. On September 25, 2017, the Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions and Professional Registration ("Department") received Vaughn's Application for Motor Vehicle Extended Service Contract Producer License ("Application").
3. Vaughn answered "Yes" to Background Information Question 1 of the Application which asked, in relevant part: "Have you ever been convicted of a crime, had a judgment withheld or deferred, received a suspended imposition of sentence ('SIS') or suspended execution of sentence ('SES'), or are you currently charged with committing a crime?"
4. As further instructed by the Application, Vaughn included court documents disclosing the following prosecutions:
  - a. On October 20, 2009, Vaughn pled guilty to Burglary in the Second Degree, a Class C Felony, in violation of § 569.170, RSMo,<sup>1</sup> and Stealing \$500 or More, a Class C Felony, in violation of § 570.030. The court suspended imposition of sentence and ordered him to complete five years' supervised probation. On June 29, 2010, the court revoked Vaughn's probation, thereby convicting him,

and ordered him to serve thirty days' incarceration. *State v. Tyler G. Vaughn*, St. Louis Co. Cir. Ct., Case No. 09SL-CR05582-01.

- b. On March 9, 2011, Vaughn pled guilty to, and was convicted of, Robbery in the Second Degree, a Class B Felony, in violation of § 569.030. The court sentenced him to five years' incarceration, but suspended execution of the sentence and ordered Vaughn to complete five years' supervised probation. *State v. Tyler G. Vaughn*, Cole Co. Cir. Ct., Case No. 10AC-CR01337-01.

### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

5. Section 385.209.1, RSMo<sup>2</sup> provides, in relevant part:

The director may suspend, revoke, refuse to issue, or refuse to renew a registration or license under sections 385.200 to 385.220 for any of the following causes, if the applicant or licensee or the applicant's or licensee's subsidiaries or affiliated entities acting on behalf of the applicant or licensee in connection with the applicant's or licensee's motor vehicle extended service contract program has:

\* \* \*

- (5) Been convicted of any felony[.]

6. The Director may refuse to issue a motor vehicle extended service contract ("MVESC") producer license to Vaughn pursuant to § 385.209.1(5) because he has been convicted of felonies, specifically:
  - a. Burglary in the Second Degree, *State v. Tyler G. Vaughn*, St. Louis Co. Cir. Ct., Case No. 09SL-CR05582-01;
  - b. Stealing \$500 or More, *id.*; and
  - c. Robbery in the Second Degree, *State v. Tyler G. Vaughn*, Cole Co. Cir. Ct., Case No. 10AC-CR01337-01.
7. Each of Vaughn's felony convictions is a separate and sufficient ground for refusal pursuant to § 385.209.1(5).
8. The Director has considered Vaughn's history and all of the circumstances surrounding Vaughn's Application. Issuing Vaughn a MVESC producer license would not be in the interest of the public. Accordingly, the Director exercises her discretion to refuse to issue Vaughn a MVESC producer license.
9. This Order is in the public interest.


